Grammar Term of the Week

More on the Apostrophe

Rule 2a. Regular nouns are nouns that form their plurals by adding either the letter s or -es (guy, guys; letter, letters; actress, actresses; etc.). To show plural possession, simply put an apostrophe after the s.

Correct: guys' night out
(guy + s + apostrophe)
Incorrect: guy's night out
(implies only one guy)

Correct: two actresses' roles
(actress + es + apostrophe)
Incorrect: two actress's roles
